# What is a Community Foundation?

**Community foundations** are organizations seeking to make long-term and meaningful philanthropy in a defined geographic area.

Local donors who want to make donations or establish a foundation, including families, individuals, businesses, and non-profit groups, can establish funds within community foundations. Those funds are then pooled to create an "endowment": the capital is invested, and the gains are used to support ongoing grantmaking.

Community foundations take a leadership role in identifying a community's challenges and pressing needs. We serve as storehouses of research, funds, and information about impact. And we provide important grants to support charitable organizations.

This model is long-term and flexible enough to respond to the changing needs of a community.

# **National Context**

Community Foundations of Canada:
Together with community foundations across the country, helps to drive local solutions for national change on the issues that matter most to Canadians.

The movement is 100+ years old with the Winnipeg Foundation as its first and one of the largest in Canada. Everyone can support communities through our foundations.

201 Community Foundations serving communities from coast to coast to coast.

More than 90% of Canadian communities have access to a community foundation — from our largest cities to our smallest towns.

Collectively we hold combined assets of more than \$6.2 billion and we've put hundreds of millions back into communities over a 100+ year history. In 2018 alone this was \$261 million.

### Local Impact

- Since our inception in 1997 we have granted over \$7 million to charities across Brantford, Brant County, Six Nations of the Grand River and the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.
- Annual grants are presently around \$700,000.

# Understanding our Granting

### Community Foundations make grants because we:

- Are invested in our communities.
- Believe in the transformative power of philanthropy.
- Have a vision of a strong, vital community that has the resources it needs to ensure quality of life for everyone.

### Vital Signs and its role in our granting:

- Helps inform where we target philanthropy.
- Represents the areas Community Foundations want to impact.
- Valuable resource for grantees looking for data to improve grant requests.

### Fund Types:

- Unrestricted
- Donor Advised
- Donor Designated
- Charitable Endowment

### **Granting Philosophy:**

> 360 degree granting to charities representing all sectors of our community relating to our Vital Signs key indicators.

# BCF Granting Eligibility Criteria

- Registered charity in good standing with the CRA with a Charitable Registration Number.
- Non-qualified donee sponsored by a registered charity agreement is signed, the charity acting as a sponsor waives the right to apply this round.
- Eligible projects and programs must have impact and enhance the quality of life of the people of Brantford, Brant County, Six Nations of the Grand River, and/or Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.
- Projects must have well-defined purpose covering a specific time period.
- > Evaluation forms from previous grant rounds must be submitted.

### Ineligibility for BCF Granting

### Projects/Programs not eligible for funding:

- Projects/programs delivered outside of designated Brant County areas.
- Sponsorships.
- Scholarships and/or bursaries.
- Fundraising events or campaigns and salaries in support of them.
- Political or religious activities.
- To individuals.

### Expenses not eligible for funding:

- Deficit reductions.
- To provide endowment funds.
- For research purposes.
- > Retroactive funding for any project expenses incurred prior to the Foundation's decision date.

# Field of Interest Funding

While we encourage applications from all sectors, the following are considered fields of interest for this round:

- ▶ Older Adults
- ► Health & Music
- ► Arts & Culture
- **►** Environment

### Tips for Writing Grants

- Make sure that your organization is eligible for the grants.
- > Ensure your program or project meets the criteria.
- All applications have a deadline make sure that the application is in before the deadline.
- > Fill out all applicable sections in the application.
- > Provide necessary documents: Financial Statements, Budgets operating; project, By-Laws
- Provide whatever is asked for or the application can be disqualified
- > Be sure to speak to the project in terms of how it benefits your stakeholder community.
- Each application is issued yearly check out new application form for requirements and questions.
- Make sure that the important details are included make use of the additional information question.
- > We cannot advise applicants on what they should apply for.

# Brant's Vital Signs


- Community-driven data program, measures vitality of a community through local data.
- Check out Vital Signs report for valuable statistics, <u>www.brantcf.ca</u>, under publications.
- Many segments will provide supporting information for applications.
- Applications for the Brant CF require that Vital Signs sectors your application addresses must be stated (drop down menu) - City Grants do not require alignment.
- Sectors: Arts & Culture, Children & Youth, Community Development,
   Education, Environment, Food Insecurity, Health & Wellness, Heritage,
   Housing Insecurity, Older Adults, Social Services.


# **Apply Page**

- When you sign in you will land on your dashboard - click the apply button at top of page to see open grant rounds
- This page contains the Application Summary: important info re. Conditions, guidelines, eligibility, processes.
- To proceed with the application, click on blue Apply button.



# Application

- Five main sections of Application:
  - 1. Charitable Status
  - 2. Application Information,
  - 3. About Your Organization,
  - 4. About Your Funding Request (\$12,500 max)
  - 5. Financial Information
- Question List button provides PDF of application questions.



# Financial Information

### Required uploads:

- Most recent annual financial statements (audited if available).
- Organization's annual budget.
- Budget for the project.
- By-laws (if BCF does not have them on file - if you are unsure, contact grants@brantcf.ca).

Include audited statements if available.



# **Saving Application**

the request.




# **Submitting Application**

- ➤Once you've completed the form, you may click the Application Packet button to download a copy of the questions and your responses.
- ➤ Click Submit Application you will be taken to a Confirmation Page
- >Click Continue to go back to the Dashboard, where you will see your submitted request.
- ➤Once an application is submitted, you can no longer edit it



# Applicant Dashboard

- You can access your Applicant Dashboard by clicking on the house icon on the top left of your screen beside Foundation's logo
- Dashboard has current and historical requests, and follow-up forms




# Applicant Dashboard

### Active & Historical Requests

- Active requests = all current requests.
  - Requests still requiring action, awaiting a decision, and/or requests not marked closed.
- Within each request you can see:
  - Forms, form statuses, form deadlines.
  - You may view forms that have been submitted (not able to edit).
  - Request's decision status.
- Edit to continue working on saved forms.

### **Historical requests:**

- Denied requests
- Requests marked closed by the site administrator



### Final Reminders

- Start now
- Check out the full application before you start (available on our website)
- Answer all the questions your opportunity to tell your story
- Remember the deadline: October 20<sup>th</sup> at 4:00PM
- System will not accept applications after that time
- Make sure you file your evaluation report when it's due you'll receive a reminder


