What is the Brant Community Foundation? A Gift that will last forever



A Message from the Foundation

As a community foundation, our goal is to ensure our grants have the greatest impact in support of charities in Brantford, Brant County, Six Nations of the Grand River and Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation. This year, a total of \$612,751 was given out to 81 local organizations enhancing arts and culture, healthcare, social and human services, environment, youth and seniors' programs.

The Foundation's mission is to create Legacy Funds and through this year's donations of \$350,122 and healthy investment earnings, the Endowment Fund total has now reached \$18.8 million.

Early in the year, Paul Williamson was the keynote speaker at the 11th annual Community Leaders Breakfast. Over 300 people attended the breakfast and were challenged to take a leadership role in their community.

COVID-19 was an unexpected twist that occurred early in 2020. Following Provincial and National guidelines the office closed in March. Fortunately, there was a smooth transition with staff working remotely and board and committee meetings held through Zoom and it was 'business as unusual'!

The Brant Community Foundation is proud to have partnered with Community Foundations of Canada and the Government of Canada for two funding programs, the Investment Readiness Program (IRP) and the Emergency Community Support Fund (ECSF).

Two local organizations received funding from IRP to start or grow their social enterprises: Sensity Deafblind and Sensory Support Network of Canada and The Raw Carrot Soup Enterprise.

ECSF launched in May 2020 and was designed to help Canada's most vulnerable populations during the COVID-19 crisis. The Foundation has an allocation of \$75,000 to disburse to local charities and will review grants in the next fiscal year.

Since 2001, the Foundation has been entrusted to administer the City of Brantford Community Grant program. The City's Legacy Grant Program has been an integral part of helping to shape the vitality and sense of belonging that we enjoy in our community. With the temporary closing of Elements Casino, the City was forced to pause the program and we await information about its reinstatement.

We want to acknowledge our board, volunteers, staff and donors who contributed to our success and send a big thank-you to all of them.






