Message from the Foundation

During the COVID-19 pandemic, every aspect of our lives changed, from the way we conducted business, attended school, and even connected with family and friends. But challenges are often met with creativity, partnerships and innovation and this was apparent in our community.

At the Brant Community Foundation, we were focused on getting grants out to organizations serving our community. We partnered with Community Foundations of Canada on three national programs, Emergency Community Support Fund (ECSF), Investment Readiness Program (IRP), and Canada Healthy Communities Initiative (CHCI), providing additional funds for local organizations to fund local needs.

The Foundation became a more responsive grant maker answering local needs as they changed because of the pandemic. Charities struggled with delivering their programs as they followed the restrictions set out to keep safe and healthy during this past year. New ways to deliver the services were developed to ensure that the most vulnerable people received the services they needed. With Foundation, ECSF, IRP and CHCI grants, the support to local organizations totalled over \$833,800, reaching the most vulnerable in our community.

The Foundation's mission is to create Legacy Funds and through donations of \$382,020 and healthy investment earnings, the total of our endowment funds has reached \$20,843,815. Endowment Funds are powerful and we thank our donors who continue to support the Foundation to build the assets for the future benefit of our community.

At the Foundation, we were pleased to take part in the Mayor's Economic Recovery Task Force to prepare a plan of action that can be taken by the City, for profit, and not-for-profit organizations and local residents to achieve a recovery from the adverse economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since 2001, the Foundation has been entrusted to administer the City of Brantford Legacy Grant program. The City had to suspend the grant program for the first half of the year but was able to reinstate the program for a partial year in the fall of 2020 supporting the well-being of the Brantford community.

We would like to say a special thank-you to retiring board member Tanya Stephens who joined the board in 2012. She has been an outstanding board member and her advice and guidance over the years has been invaluable.

This has been an unusual year, with COVID-19 having impacted everyone. Our thanks to our board, committee members, staff and volunteers who continued to support the Foundation's mission and vision. With their strong support and leadership, we were able to build our grant impact and community resilience as we move forward during these challenging times.





Established in 2012, the Donald and Jo-Anne Wilkin Fund supports a number of charitable causes that are important to them and to their family.

Donald and Jo-Anne sit down with their family to discuss possible projects that will have an impact on our community. The charities they support can be ones where they volunteer or others that provide much needed assistance to support the well-being of the community. There are a number of causes that are important to them, and they are long-time volunteers and annual supporters of the Canadian Military Heritage Museum of Brant.

This year, they were pleased to make a pledge to the new Brant Community Health Hub building. Both Donald and Jo-Anne are long-time residents of Brant County and spent their early years in Paris when the population was approximately 4,500 persons.

The town of Paris in those days certainly grew at a more leisurely pace, offering them a most enjoyable time to grow and mature. A much smaller Willett Hospital along with five doctors adequately looked after the population of the day. Today, with a much larger population and busier society, the new medical center will serve the growing community and they felt compelled to donate.


FIELD OF INTEREST

Our Grants

Vulnerable populations across Canada continue to be disproportionately affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. Marginalized groups, youth, children and the elderly, essential workers and newcomers are just some of the communities facing increased challenges. Foundation grants supported organizations throughout the pandemic with much-needed support for operating and program delivery.

The Brant Community Foundation is proud to have partnered with Community Foundations of Canada and the Government of Canada to deliver the Emergency Community Support Fund (ECSF) in the Brant, Brantford, Six Nations of the Grand River and Mississaugas of the Credit First Nations area. Since the start of the pandemic, charities and non-profit organizations lead the charge to assist those most in need. Through the ECSF program, \$125,000 additional support was given out for local programs assisting the most vulnerable.

Our Foundation also partnered with Brant, Halton and Peel community foundations for another opportunity to support local charities through the Federal Investment Readiness Program. The purpose of the non-repayable capital was to improve agency capacity to invest in innovation to start or expand social enterprises to support their organizations.



Grand River Council on Aging “Community at Home” project Creating Age Friendly Communities

The Grand River Council on Aging (GRCOA) accepted the challenge of adapting to a more virtual environment with the development and delivery of a pilot “Community at Home” project. The program aims at combating social isolation, and promoting health and wellness.

The project involved presenting bi-weekly Zoom events that encourage social participation and provide community connections, while creating awareness about topics and issues of interest to seniors through guest speakers.

The grant enabled the GRCOA to determine what is required to recruit and train volunteers, develop technical expertise, plan content, and involve community organizations in the presentation of topics of interest. Participants meet new people and become a part of a larger community of volunteers and professionals dedicated to healthy aging and well-being.

As a result, they will continue to provide the bi-weekly program.


